

## The Hinton Fair Celebrates 116 Years of Family Fun Next Thursday



Community run fairs are a mainstay of late summer and early fall in Western Oklahoma and one of the longest running fairs in the state is keeping that tradition alive in Hinton, OK. The Hinton Fair will take place at the Hinton Fairgrounds from Thursday, August 27 through Saturday, August 29. The event will open at 7pm each night.

The Hinton Fair is marking it's 116th year of operation and has become one of Western Oklahoma's most anticipated events. Under the stewardship of the Hinton Fair Association and with the help of the residents of Hinton the fair has obtained some of the most thrilling fair attractions in the whole state. In 2022 The Hinton Community Fair unveiled the refurbished "Okie Zip Giant Slide" a ride that many Oklahoman's might remember from it's days at the Oklahoma State Fair and in 2024 they unleashed "The Scrambler."

Along with the rides the Hinton Fair also has a vibrant midway with various game booths, food stands, as well as live entertainment every night. On Thursday night the Hinton Fair will host Blue Bluegrass and Gospel band Blue Tradition playing from 7-9 pm with Hinton musician Brett Deviney playing 9-close. On Friday night, Country and Western musician Cowboy Jim will play from 7-8:30pm. Local musician Chance Williams playing from 8:30-9:30pm, and OKC based Rachel Lynch wrapping up from 9:30pm to close.

Dr. Melody Diann Ashenfelter was born on January 20, 1955, in Marysville, California, the oldest surviving child of Dale Wayne Ashenfelter and Betty Ruth (East) Ashenfelter. She died peacefully in Weatherford, OK, on August 10, 2026,

with her sisters by her side.

Soon after Melody's birth, the family of three moved back to the family farm north of Gotebo, OK, near the community of Lake Valley, to be close to grandparents, Jacob and Maggie (Kelso) Ashenfelter and Orin and Edith (Mandrell) East. Sisters, Debra and Sharla, were soon added to make the family of five complete. Melody worked beside her parents and sisters on the family farm and attended Gotebo Public School. She was active in Sharon Missionary Baptist Church, located just a few miles from her home, where she accepted Jesus as her Savior at an early age and soon became the first of the Ashenfelter sisters to serve as church pianist.

Melody graduated from Gotebo Public School in 1973 and headed to Southwestern Oklahoma State University, where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting and Secondary Education in 1976. She then left to attend Oklahoma State University for coursework toward a master's degree in business education, which she completed in 1978. Meanwhile, in August 1977, Melody took her first teaching position at Eastern Oklahoma State College in Wilburton, OK, teaching Business Education. Melody remained at Wilburton until December 1986, with a one-year leave of absence from 1983-1984, when she returned to OSU to pursue her doctorate.

In May 1986, Melody completed her doctoral thesis and received her Doctor of Education degree from OSU. That December, Melody moved back to Weatherford to accept a teaching position at Southwestern Oklahoma State University (SWOSU) for the Spring 1987 semester. At SWOSU, Melody built a career spanning 33 years, teaching upper-level accounting to more than a generation of SWOSU students, before retiring in May 2019. While teaching full-time at SWOSU, Melody obtained her CPA in July 1988 and was an instructor for Becker CPA Review Courses for nine years, from 1991 to 2000, and proctored CPA exams for the Oklahoma Accountancy Board for several years.

During Melody's career at SWOSU, she received several promotions before retiring as a tenured Professor as the Everett Dobson Endowed Chair of Accounting. She served in several leadership roles and on committees, including tenure and accreditation committees.

That humor is exactly how those who knew her best will remember her. Laughter was part of who she was, and she had a way of bringing joy into everyday life.

There are countless memories of her that will continue to make her loved ones smile. Through all the stories, laughter, and activity, family remained at the center of Janette's life.

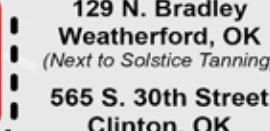

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**SAYRE / GARBAGE INCREASE** - Officials with the city of Sayre recently revealed that a rate increase for garbage pickup went into effect on July 1 and will be reflected on August’s billing statements. There is now a 10% increase to residential and commercial pickup. The standard residential rate has increased by \$2.35 per month. City officials say the increase is due to higher fuel costs and necessary upgrades to outdated equipment.

**CLINTON / FRISCO CENTER** - The Frisco Conference Center in Clinton continues to remain busy each year, according to Chamber of Commerce President Julie Caldwell. “We counted the last year from July 1st to June 30th at 302 events. We had 301 the year before, So I feel like one [year] did better,” Caldwell joked. The facility recently hosted a municipal court clerks conference in early August.

**SWOSU / PARKER HALL** - Renovations to Parker Hall on the Weatherford campus of Southwestern Oklahoma State University will allow for more nursing students following some recent renovations of the building’s third floor. The project was made possible due to “deferred maintenance” funds from the Oklahoma state legislature. “Nursing is on the first floor, Psychology is on the second floor, and for the past couple of decades, the third floor has just been vacant.” SWOSU President Dr. Joel Kendall revealed. “There were a lot of renovations that had to be done for anything to be up there.” The additional space will allow the university to accept 50 nursing students each in the fall and spring semesters. “Because of [state funding], we were able to finish out the third floor of Parker Hall. Functionally, what that’s going to allow us to do is double the size of our nursing program, and that’s needed [because] we have a nursing shortage,” Kendall said, adding that SWOSU’s Nursing courses are fully booked for the 2026-27 school year. “We have our great traditional BSN program, with Elyssa Saunders running it here in town.”

**WEATHERFORD / SALES TAX** - It was another up month for sales tax receipts in the city of Weatherford. Receipts for June sales were up just over 11%, collecting more than \$1.2 million. According to Economic Development Director Yolanda Creswell, this marks the highest sales tax receipt in the city of Weatherford. To date, the city is up more than 9.5%. Sales tax receipts have been up in the city for 16 out of the past 17 months.

**CLINTON PS / FORMER MIDDLE SCHOOL** Further steps were taken during a recent Clinton Board of Education meeting regarding the former middle school facility. “We did surplus the middle school building last night; that’s our first step [to] looking at what we want to do with the old middle school,” explained Superintendent Nathan Meget. “Our next step is we're going to get those buildings appraised and that property appraised.” Meget added that the appraisals will hopefully lead to a bidding process for potential interested buyers.

**WEATHERFORD / ROUTE 66 SHIELD** - A new space-themed Route 66 shield has arrived in Weatherford as part of a project by the State Lt. Governor's Office to award Oklahoma towns along Route 66 with a specialized monument. “Through the process, I had to fill out surveys, the history of Weatherford, and just did a whole thing. They had a design team that made it [for us],” Economic Development Director Yolanda Creswell shared about the new addition. “Our spaceman is so popular throughout the United States, so we really focused on that spaceman, and it came with the colors, our tourism logo, and then it just all came together. But what's exciting about those, each shield was sponsored by businesses or corporations throughout the state. Ours was paid for by PSO and Devon Energy.” The shield came at no cost to the city of Weatherford and is located in front of Jerry’s Diner.

**WEATHERFORD / ROBOTIC SURGERY** SWOSU was recently awarded grant funding through the Rural Health Transformation program, which will be used to implement a robotic surgical system in the future at Weatherford Regional Hospital. “For us to recruit general surgeons and OB-GYNs in the future, robotic surgery is a big piece of that,” Chief Executive Officer Darin Farrell shared on how this will impact the future of healthcare in the area. “There are certain surgeries done with the assistance of the robot that makes a much shorter recovery time for patients, certain hernias, hysterectomies, different things like that. Patients have less intense recoveries, and it allows us to recruit those surgeons and specialists in the future.” Dr. Jacob Swords will be joining the hospital at the end of August and is already trained in robotic surgery. Farrell added the new service will allow for more procedures to be done locally. The robotic surgical equipment is fully guided by trained surgeons for enhanced precision during operations.

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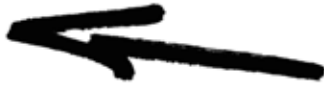
