

Clinton Celebrates Rt. 66 with Century Lap and Little Cruisers Race



Clinton will be rolling back into the spirit of Route 66 on Saturday, September 5, 2026, with a full day of family-friendly activities celebrating the Mother Road's 100th anniversary.

As part of the Route 66 Centennial celebration, Clinton will host Clinton's Century Lap on Route 66, bringing classic cars, motorcycles, vendors, food trucks and family activities to Frisco Avenue.

"This festival is a chance for Clinton to celebrate our Route 66 history, bring people to our community, and showcase our local businesses. It's a big moment for Clinton, and we're excited to be part of it," said Julie Caldwell, director of the Clinton Chamber of Commerce.

The event invites car enthusiasts and the community to cruise into Clinton and celebrate a century of history along Route 66. A car show will be featured, along with vendors and food trucks

offering plenty of opportunities for visitors to enjoy the day.

Families can also enjoy a Kids Zone, making the celebration an event for Route 66 fans of all ages. Motorcyclists will have something to enjoy as well, with motorcycles featured as part of the day's activities.

Adding to the excitement for young Route 66 fans will be the Route 66 Little Cruisers Power Wheels race. Children will compete in two age divisions: ages 2-4 and ages 5-7.

The Little Cruisers race will take place Saturday, with lineup beginning at 11:30 a.m. and the race starting at 11:45 a.m. Participants are encouraged to get their Power Wheels charged and race-ready. The race is limited to battery-powered ride-on vehicles. Prizes will be awarded in both age divisions.

"We really want this to be a day the whole family

can enjoy. The Little Cruisers race is going to be so much fun for the kids, and we hope families come out, spend the day with us, and enjoy everything happening downtown," said Caldwell.

The Little Cruisers event and Clinton's Century Lap are being presented as part of the community's celebration of the Route 66 Centennial, marking 100 years since Route 66 was established in 1926.

With cars, motorcycles, food, vendors and activities for children, Clinton's September 5 celebration offers residents and visitors a chance to experience the excitement of Route 66 while celebrating the road's lasting connection to the Clinton community.

He and Faye worked hard and made many sacrifices to keep the plant running so long. Carl called the plant closing "bittersweet" in a Sayre Record-Democrat article and said the relationships made through the years were the best part of running the business.

After the closing of the plant, Carl worked at the United Supermarket meat market. Carl also developed his hobby of woodworking into a side business of clockmaking. He and Faye traveled to hundreds of craft shows throughout Oklahoma, Texas, Kansas and Arkansas selling his clocks which ranged from desk and wall clocks to large oak mantle clocks. He loved to work in his wood shop where he listened to country music while sawing, sanding and staining his signature clocks. He and Faye moved to League City TX in 2007 to live close to their son and his family. Carl managed the Pecan Forest Townhomes and his handyman skills were appreciated by the residents. After several years in Texas, they moved to Blanchard, OK, to live near their daughter and son-in-law. Carl spent his final years before retirement working for Chickasha Meat Company. 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Hinton Senior Center’s Townwide Garage and Bake Sales Returning in Early September

Hinton’s annual Townwide Garage Sale returns to the city on September 4 – 5, from 9am to 5pm. The event will be held across the town of Hinton, including at the Hinton Senior Center at 515 West Main Street.

A long list of items will be on sale from various city residents, including furniture, clothing, appliances, vehicles, and more. Some of the smaller scale household items up for grabs include books, bed sheets, and toys from a recently closed church nursery. The event is still accepting new items to sell, but only on a case-by-case basis (aside from clothing, which has seen a record number of submissions and are no longer being accepted).

The Hinton Senior Center will also be hosting a Bake Sale. As with their Garage Sale offerings, items available depend on what’s submitted by local

community members. Projected goodies include Banana Bread, Cinnamon Rolls, and Strawberry Bread, along with the “bake sale staples” of pies, cakes, and cookies.

Marlene Walker, one of the organizers of this event, hopes this will help promote the Nutrition Center’s fight against food insecurity in western Oklahoma, providing more nutritious offering to our neighbors who struggle to put food on the table. “Last year, we served 5,000 people—nearly 1,200 more than the last year—and we’re expecting to break that record again this year,” Walker expressed. “We ask for a \$2 donation, but there are people who can’t even afford that, and we are more than happy to help them too. We rely on private donations, but we get those goals [while helping those who can’t contribute].”

ELK CITY / BUILDING REMODEL - A remodel project is underway to a downtown Elk City building that will be occupied by Boomerang Diner. “We had made a deal with Boomerang Diner, Weatherford had also made a deal with one to bring them in downtown,” shared City Manager Tom Ivester. “It’s going to be extensive remodeling there at the corner of Broadway and Main. [That] building needed extensive remodeling. We hope to have that done within the next 2-3 months.” The building has been unoccupied for about 25 to 30 years.

GEARY / PS GROUNDBREAKING - A groundbreaking ceremony was held recently for the construction of a new Pre-K through 12th grade school building for Geary Public Schools following a fire at the current schoolhouse. “It was born from tragedy, of course. Just a terrible situation, losing our historical gymnasium,” District Superintendent Sean Buchanan shared. “And because of smoke damage, we lost the majority of the high school, too. Thankfully, our community saw the value in supporting our children and these folks overwhelmingly approved an additional \$5 million bond that we could stick with our insurance money here and build a new pre-K12 all-inclusive facility.” Buchanan is hopeful that the project will be complete in roughly the next 16 months.

CUSTER CO / BRIDGES - A Weatherford man has waived a preliminary hearing in Custer County District Court and has been bound over to answer to a charge of manslaughter in the first degree in commission of a misdemeanor. 25-year-old Jonathan David Bridges is charged with the alleged shooting death of another person at 406 Texas Street in Weatherford in November of last year. Bridges will appear back in court for formal arraignment on September 14th.

CUSTER CO / BURN BAN - Custer County is now in a burn ban for the next 14 days, as decided by county commissioners. No controlled burns are permitted while the ban is in place, but there are some exceptions, says Emergency Management Director Hardy Sperle. “Those exceptions are construction projects, welding and cutting, torching, grinding activities, campers and outdoor cooking and public firework display [by a] licensed firework professional.” The burn ban is in effect. Officials will continue to monitor weather conditions to determine if the ban can be lifted following the 14-day period. Additionally, Caddo County commissioners decided to implement a 14-day burn ban.

HINTON PS / THREAT - Hinton Public School officials revealed that a high school student was confronted by a school administrator yesterday for threatening behavior directed at another student. During the escort to the office, the student made a threat towards the administrator, and the school and officials say the student who made the threats was removed from school. Officials say the threats were not specific in nature but will be fully investigated by both school administration and law enforcement. Hinton Police has started an investigation, and school officials say the student will not be allowed to return to school until the district can determine it is safe for all students.

HYDRO / BOIL ORDER LIFTED - Officials with the town of Hydro say the boil order has been lifted after E. Coli was previously found in the drinking water. An official water lab report conducted this week shows all water samples came back completely clear with no signs of E. Coli. The water is now safe for human consumption.

CLINTON / PS GRANT - Clinton Public School officials say the district has received a \$10,000 LaunchOK grant that will expand STEM and aerospace education opportunities for district students. The investment will give students more opportunities to explore STEM, aerospace, aviation and other high-demand career pathways.

CLINTON / FRITO-LAY - Clinton Mayor David Berrong discussed growth within the city, highlighting a more recent development regarding a new Frito-Lay distribution center. “One thing people don’t know is that in our industrial park, just at the end of last year, our Economic Developer at that time had coaxed in and had made available a new transport company in our industrial park out south of town,” Berrong shared. The center offers job opportunities and continued economic growth.

WEATHERFORD / HOSPITAL FINANCES - With Medicaid cuts on the horizon, several rural Oklahoma hospitals could face closure. However, Weatherford Regional Hospital Chief Executive Officer Darin Farrel says financially the hospital is currently solid. “We’re busier than we’ve ever been. We have a new general surgeon that’s starting, he’s on site already. He’s going to start seeing patients in a couple of weeks.” Additionally, the hospital recently received a grant that will help get a new surgical robotic system which will allow for quicker patient recovery time and with less pain involved.

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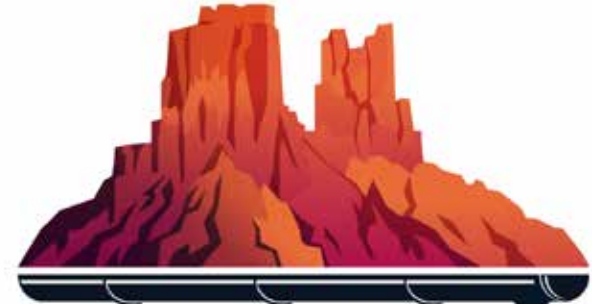

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Southwest Playhouse’s Dinner and Production of Oklahoma Next Month

As Route 66 celebrates its 100th anniversary this fall, the city of Clinton is marking the milestone with a signature event pairing an old-fashioned chuckwagon dinner with an outdoor production of Rodgers and Hammerstein's Oklahoma! at the historic McLain Rogers Park amphitheater. The nine-performance run opens September 18 and continues on weekends through October 4. Presented in partnership by Southwest Playhouse, the Clinton Chamber of Commerce, and the City of Clinton, the event will bring Rodgers and Hammerstein's beloved Broadway classic to the WPA-era amphitheater built in the 1930s and

preserved along the Mother Road. Tickets and full event details are now available at OklahomaOn66.com, a new unified website launched this week to make it easy for visitors to plan the full evening in one stop. "Oklahoma is where this story was born, and Route 66 is how the country came to know it," said Julie Caldwell, president of the Clinton Chamber of Commerce. "To bring the two together on the same stage, in the same night, in the Centennial year — that's something special. The chuckwagon dinner is served from 5:00 to 7:00 PM at the baseball field adjacent to McLain Rogers Park and features three meats, two sides, and a drink for \$25 per plate; children 12 and under are \$15. Golf cart shuttles will carry guests between event parking at The Edge Church, 1005 S 10th St, and the park itself. Curtain for Oklahoma! is 7:30 PM on all nine performance nights: September 18, 19, and 20; September 25, 26, and 27; and October 2, 3, and 4. Show tickets are \$25 plus tax and fees and are available through Southwest Playhouse. Because the dinner and the show are hosted by two separate organizations, they are sold as two tickets on two ticketing systems. McLain Rogers Park is located at the intersection of S 10th Street and Jaycee Lane in Clinton, on Historic Route 66. Blankets and stadium seats are welcome throughout the amphitheater; single-person lawn chairs are permitted in the back two-thirds of the venue. The production takes place outdoors and is subject to weather; canceled performances will be exchangeable for another date, subject to availability.
